



Highlights

- In July 2018, a total of 499 suspected cholera cases including 1 associated death was reported from Hiraan, Banadir, Lower Jubba, Lower Shabelle and Middle Shabelle regions; the case fatality rate is 0.20%.
- Since December 2017, a total of 5 995 suspected cholera cases including 41 associated deaths (CFR: 0.68 %) has been reported from five regions. The districts with the highest cumulative number of cases are Kismayo (2 232), Jowhar (558) and Beletweyn (522).
- The number of reported cases during month of July showed a remarkable decrease as compared to the previous month (1 340). The highest number of cases were reported during the month of May (1 471) and during following months a declining trend observed in the reported cases.
- A total of 248 stool specimen were collected form 6 Cholera Treatment Centers (CTCs), during January to June 2018, out of which 79 have been confirmed for *Vibrio Cholerae*, serotype Ogawa.


