


Highlights

- In September 2018, a total of 144 suspected cholera cases and no related death was reported from Banadir and Lower Jubba regions.
- Since December 2017, a total of 6 383 suspected cholera cases including 42 related deaths (CFR: 0.66 %) has been reported from five regions. The districts with the highest cumulative number of cases are Kismayo (2 305), Hodan (577) and Jowhar (558).
- The number of reported cases during month of September showed a remarkable decrease as compared to the previous month (244). The highest number of cases were reported during the month of May (1471) and during following months a declining trend observed in the reported cases.
- A total of 278 stool specimen were collected from 6 Cholera Treatment Centers (CTCs), from January to September 2018, out of which 85 have been confirmed for *Vibrio Cholerae*, serotype Ogawa.


