**NOMINATION OF A MEMBER STATE TO THE JOINT
COORDINATING BOARD OF THE SPECIAL PROGRAMME FOR
RESEARCH AND TRAINING IN TROPICAL DISEASES**

1. Composition of the Joint Coordinating Board of the Special Programme for Research and Training in Tropical Diseases

The Joint Coordinating Board of the UNDP/World Bank/WHO Special Programme for Research and Training in Tropical Diseases (TDR) consists of 30 members drawn from among the cooperating parties as follows:

- twelve government representatives selected by contributors to the resources of the Special Programme;
- twelve government representatives selected by WHO's regional committees from among those countries directly affected by the diseases dealt with by the Special Programme, or from among those providing technical or scientific support to the Special Programme. The Governments of Tunisia and Islamic Republic of Iran are the current members selected by the Regional Committee for the Eastern Mediterranean, serving on the JCB (Tunisia until 31 December 1997 and Islamic Republic of Iran until 31 December 1998);
- three members designated by the JCB itself from among the remaining cooperating parties;
- the three agencies that comprise the Standing Committee (i.e. UNDP, World Bank and WHO).

2. Observer status on the Joint Coordinating Board

Other cooperating parties may, on request, be represented as observers, upon approval by the Joint Coordinating Board. EMR Member States who have observer status are: Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Morocco, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Syrian Arab Republic and Republic of Yemen.

3. Member States selected by the Regional Committee for the Eastern Mediterranean to the Joint Coordinating Board

The following Member States were previously selected by the Regional Committee for the Eastern Mediterranean to the Joint Coordinating Board:

Pakistan	1978–1980 (3 years)
Iraq	1980–1982 (3 years)
Yemen Arab Republic	1984–1985 (2 years)
Sudan	1984–1986 (3 years)
Islamic Republic of Iran	1986–1988 (3 years)
Morocco	1987–1989 (3 years)
Somalia	1989–1991 (3 years)
Republic of Yemen	1990–1992 (3 years)
Egypt	1992–1994 (3 years)
Saudi Arabia	1993–1995 (3 years)
Tunisia	1995–1997 (3 years)
Islamic Republic of Iran	1996–1998 (3 years)

As of 1 January 1998, there will be one vacancy from the Eastern Mediterranean Region to replace Tunisia, whose term will end on 31 December 1997. The Regional Committee is requested to nominate one Member State to serve on the JCB for a three-year period, 1 January 1998 to 31 December 2000.
