

OLIO TRANSMISSION

 No new Wild Poliovirus (WPV1) cases and 2 new cVDPV2 cases were confirmed in June 2021



- 321 children with Acute Flaccid Paralysis (AFP)

 138 females and 183 males were reported in June 2021. A total of 2,102 AFP cases have been reported since the beginning of 2021. Of these, 2,003 cases have been discarded as non-polio. About 53 cases are pending final classification
- The non-polio AFP rate remained above 8, stool adequacy stood above 88%, and non-polio enterovirus rate ranged between 10-18 in all regions
- No new WPV1 and 2 new cVDPV2 positive environmental samples were confirmed in June 2021

COMPLEMENTARY VACCINATION ACTIVITIES

- 13 cross-border vaccination points, 49 crossborder teams and 200 permanent transit teams (PTTs) were operational in June 2021
- Permanent transit teams vaccinated 562,017 children, and cross-border teams vaccinated 79,834 children against polio in June 2021
- 493 children under 10 were given OPV in UNHCR repatriation centre and IOM sites receiving returnees and refugees from Pakistan and Iran in June 2021
- Between Jan to end of June, 3,473 returnee children were vaccinated with OPV and 187 children with IPV, respectively
- 2,625 international travelers were vaccinated in June 2021 in compliance with IHR

PEI support to COVID-19 till end of June 2021

- 107,300 suspected cases of COVID-19 were reported
- 339,734 polio health workers, government and NGO staff were trained on COVID-19 surveillance
- 270,820 community and religious influencers were reached for support and training

Key communication activities

- 219,235 caregivers (including 151,047 females) were engaged in polio, routine immunization, mother and child health (MNCH) promotion and COVID-19 prevention awareness sessions by the Immunization Communication Network (ICN) through house-to-house visits and community meetings in the south, southeast, and northeast regions
- 1,253 residents including female students, women and youth were engaged through 40 educational sessions on poliovirus transmission and prevention by the community engagement promoters in the west region
- 535 elderly female household members who have influence in decision making in families, and representatives from the local directorates of women's affairs were reached with health education messages on polio vaccination, routine immunization (RI) and ways to fight the poliovirus in the south region
- 521,158 females were reached with polio and mother and child health awareness by the female mobilizers/vaccinators (FMVs) through 54,996 sessions in east, west, south and southeast regions
- 1,362 individuals, including religious influencers, local authorities and community influencers were reached with awareness sessions through the provincial Islamic advisory groups in the south, southeast, east, and west regions
- 336,255 under five children were given polio vaccine drops and 49,606 girls and women received tetanus (TT) vaccine from the FMVs in the south, southeast, west, and east regions
