Estimated resource requirements to be budgeted for in the proposed Programme budget for 2024–2025, in US\$: US\$ 2 300 000</p> <p>By end of 2023, a systematic approach would be expected to support some countries of the Region to adopt a portfolio of planned digital health services within their action plan. Such implementation would require technical and financial support, engaging appropriate stakeholders and partners. Meanwhile, efforts are still required to facilitate the engagement of national stakeholders to initiate national dialogue for developing an action plan in many countries in the Region. More capacity-building events are needed and three-level coordination efforts are required to learn from lessons in pilot countries.</p>

Estimated resource requirements to be budgeted for in the proposed Programme budgets of future biennia, in US\$: US\$ 2 400 000</p> <p>A maturity model for digital health and innovation is expected to lead the development at regional level and more country investment would be facilitated through country offices.</p>
