Sexual and reproductive health

Survivors endure immediate and longterm sexual and reproductive health problems – with immeasurable social and economic costs to themselves, their families and communities.

What are the consequences?



Low birthweight babies

Survivors are 16% more likely to have a low birth-weight baby



Miscarriage

Survivors are 2 times more likely to have a miscarriage

Health care providers are ideally placed to address these consequences and support survivors:

- Evidence shows that survivors of violence are more likely than other individuals to seek health services, even if they do not disclose the associated violence.
- Health services offer a culturally and socially appropriate entry point for survivors.
- The health sector is often women's first point of professional contact after they experience gender-based violence.



HIV

Survivors are 1.5 times more likely to contract HIV



Other STIs

Survivors are 1.5 times more likely to contract syphilis, chlamydia or gonorrhoea



Compounded risk

Forcibly displaced women are at increased risk of physical and sexual violence
